REMARKS FROM THE PUBLIC FOR THE GOOD AND WELFARE OF THE BOROUGH [Reported by Deputy Borough Clerk Patricia A. McKim.]

40. Michael Sutera, 386 Knickerbocker Road said they are having a problem with particular neighbors and noise. The volume and duration this past weekend was so bad we called the police. The noise, which included a sound truck, went on for over 6 hours. It was within the defined hours, but is it reasonable for a resident to be subjected to it for a prolonged period of time? The noise is something that happens frequently. I didn't see anything definitive mentioned about decibel levels in the ordinance. Is it possible for the Council to put in specific guidelines that comply with the State? Deputy Chief Domville said he has two noise complaints, one from last year and this recent one.

Mr. Sutera said in October 2017 the same individuals, without permission, expanded their residence on their primary property onto their second parcel. Mayor Romeo said the owner was advised to apply for a subdivision, cutting back the impervious coverage and keep them as two separate properties. Construction Official Bob Rusch said the homeowner has not come in yet.

Anna Garella, 382 Knickerbocker Road said the noise level on June 16th was intolerable. My house was vibrating and we had to leave our home as did the Suteras.

Mayor Romeo said the impervious coverage issue needs to be dealt with immediately. Mayor Romeo asked Deputy Chief Domville about the noise. D.C. Domville said they responded and the residents said they will be in compliance with the noise ordinance, which is 11:00 pm on Saturdays. Mayor Romeo said we've never had to change the noise ordinance because it's usually a one-time event. But apparently this is not the case. We'll discuss this at the next COW meeting. Council Member Mueller asked Mr. Sutera to give the noise information he has regarding State guidance for municipalities to Attorney Salvatore. Mayor Romeo said we will start dealing with this immediately.

Council Member Olmo said this is Mrs. Nasuto's last meeting and I would like to thank her for making my job easy and keeping everything running smoothly. Council Member Spina agreed.

Mrs. Nasuto said she appreciates all the time and effort the Mayor, Council, Attorney, etc. all put in. It's very rare to have a Mayor through almost your whole career, which I've had. It's been a pleasure working for this group. I will miss you all and thank you for letting me serve you.

Mayor Romeo closed by saying he could not and would not have done the job without Mrs. Nasuto.
